

VILLAGE OF CORRALES STATE OF NEW MEXICO

ORDINANCE NO. 22-05

AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE OF CORRALES ("RECIPIENT") TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE NEW MEXICO ENVIRONMENT DEPARTMENT ("NMED") FOR THE PURPOSE OF OBTAINING PROJECT FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$75,000 FOR PROJECT #CWSRF 124 DESIGN OF WASTEWATER SYSTEM, AS APPROVED BY NMED; DECLARING THE NECESSITY FOR THE FUNDS; PRESCRIBING OTHER DETAILS CONCERNING THE FUNDS.

Capitalized terms used in the following preambles are defined in Section 1 of this Ordinance unless the context requires otherwise.

WHEREAS, the Recipient is a legally and regularly created public body organized under the general laws of the State of New Mexico ("State"); and

WHEREAS, the Recipient now owns, operates, and maintains a public utility constituting a Wastewater system ("System"), which includes a system for disposing of wastes by surface and underground methods; and

WHEREAS, the present System is insufficient and inadequate to meet the needs of the Recipient; and

WHEREAS, the funds for this Project will include funds from a one-time federal grant to the NMED from the Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA"); and

WHEREAS, the Project is subject to specific requirements of the federal grant; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Recipient has determined that it is in the best interest of the Recipient to accept and enter into the Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE VILLAGE OF CORRALES:

Section 1. DEFINITIONS. As used in the Ordinance, the following terms shall have the meanings specified below, unless the context clearly requires otherwise (such meanings to be equally applicable to both the singular and the plural forms of the terms defined unless the plural form is separately defined):

15	ACT. The general laws of the State, including the Wastewater Facility Construction Loan
16	Act at sections 74-6A-1 to 74-6A-15 NMSA 1978, as amended; enactments of the governing
17	Body of the Recipient relating to Agreement made by resolution or ordinance, including this
18	Ordinance; and the powers of the Recipient as a public body under authority given by the
19	Constitution and Statutes of the State.

51	ANNUAL AUDIT or SINGLE AUDIT. Financial statements of the Recipient as of the
52	end of each Fiscal Year, audited by an Independent Accountant, consistent with the federal
53	Single Audit Act and the State Auditor's rules.

55	AUTHORIZED OFFICER. The Recipient's mayor, chief administrative officer, or
56	other officer or employee of the Recipient as designated by the Recipient's Resolution Number
57	22-63 to be adopted by the governing body of the Recipient, as amended.

51	FISCAL YEAR. The twelve-month period commencing on the first day of July of each
62	year and ending on the last day of June of the succeeding year, or any other twelve-month period
53	which the Recipient hereafter may establish as the fiscal year or the System.

55	FUNDS. Loan and or Subsidy Grant funds.

57	GOVERNING BODY OF THE RECIPIENT Village of Corrales Village Council.

69	LOAN. A loan of funds from NMED made pursuant to the Agreement.

71	AGREEMENT. The agreement between the Recipient and the NMED, pursuant to
72	which funds will be provided to the Recipient to construct the Project and pay eligible costs
73	relating thereto.

75	SUBSIDY GRANT. A sub-grant of funds to the Recipient from a one-time federal grant
76	of funds to the NMED by EPA, for the purpose of subsidizing the funding amount provided to
77	the Recipient under the Agreement.

79	NMSA. New Mexico Statutes Annotated, 1978 Compilation, as amended and
30	supplemented.

32	OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE . All reasonable and necessary current expenses
33	of the System, paid or accrued, relating to operating, maintaining, and repairing the System.

35	ORDINANCE . This Ordinance as amended or supplemented from time to time.

37	PROJECT. The most current NMED approved Project Description listed on the Project
88	Description Form on file with NMED.
39	
90	PROJECT COMPLETION DATE. Means the date that operations of the completed

works are initiated or capable of being initiated, whichever is earlier. This also applies to 91 92 individual phases or segments. 93 94 **REGULATIONS**. Regulations promulgated by the Water Quality Control Commission 95 at 20.7.5 NMAC and New Mexico Environment Department at 20.7.6 – 20.7.7 NMAC. 96 Section 2. RATIFICATION. All action heretofore taken (not inconsistent with the 97 98 provisions of the Ordinance) by the Board, the officers, and employees of the Recipient, directed toward the Agreement, is hereby ratified, approved, and confirmed. 99 100 Section 3. FINDINGS. The Governing Body of the Recipient hereby declares that it has 101 considered all necessary and relevant information and data and hereby makes the following 102 103 findings: 104 105 (A) The execution and delivery of the Agreement pursuant to the Act to provide funds to finance the Project, is necessary and in the interest of the public health, safety, and welfare of 106 the residents of the Recipient and will result in savings of finance costs to the Recipient. 107 108 (B) The money available for the Project from all sources other than the Agreement is 109 not sufficient to pay when due the cost of the Project. 110 111 112 (C) The Project is and will be part of the System. 113 114 Section 4. SYSTEM. The System shall continue to constitute a Wastewater system and shall be operated and maintained as such. 115 116 117 Section 5. AUTHORIZATION OF PROJECT. The acquisition and construction of the Project and payment of eligible items as set forth in the Regulations from proceeds of the 118 119 Agreement is hereby authorized at a cost not to exceed the amount of \$75,000 excluding any cost of the Project to be paid from any source other than the proceeds of the Agreement. 120 121 Section 6. AUTHORIZATION OF AGREEMENT. 122 123 (A) For the purpose of protecting the public health, conserving the property, and protecting the general welfare of the residents of the Recipient and acquiring the Project, it is 124 hereby declared necessary that the Recipient, pursuant to the Act and the Regulations execute 125 and deliver the Agreement, and the Recipient is hereby authorized to execute and deliver the 126 Agreement. The NMED has agreed to disburse the proceeds according to the terms of the 127 Agreement to the Recipient over the construction period of the Project. 128 129 **(B)** The form of the Agreement is approved. An Authorized Officer is hereby 130 authorized and directed to execute and deliver the Agreement and any extensions of or 131 amendments to any such document to be executed after completion of the Project, or any 132 substitution therefore, with such changes therein consistent with the Ordinance and as shall be 133

approved by an Authorized Officer whose execution thereof, or any extension thereof, or

substitution therefore, in their final forms shall constitute conclusive evidence of their approval

and compliance with this section.

138	(C) From and after the date of the initial execution and delivery of the Agreement,
139	Authorized Officers, agents, and employees of the Recipient are authorized, empowered, and
140	directed to do all such acts and things and to execute all such documents as may be necessary to
141	carry out and comply with the provisions of this Ordinance and the Agreement.
142	
143	Section 7. OPERATION OF PROJECT. The Recipient will operate and maintain the
144	Project so that it will function properly over its structural and material design life.
145	
146	Section 8. USE OF PROCEEDS. The NMED shall disburse Funds pursuant to the
147	Agreement for NMED approved costs incurred by the Recipient for the Project.
148	
149	Section 9. ENFORCEMENT; VENUE. The NMED retains the right to seek
150	enforcement of the terms of the Agreement. If the NMED and the Recipient cannot reach
151	agreement regarding disputes as to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, such disputes are
152	to be resolved promptly and expeditiously in the district court of Santa Fe County. The Recipient
153	agrees that the district court for Santa Fe County shall have exclusive jurisdiction over the
154	Recipient and the subject matter of this Agreement and waives the right to challenge such
155	jurisdiction.
156	
157	Section 10. AMENDMENT OF ORDINANCE. This Ordinance may be amended with
158	the prior written consent of the NMED.
159	
160	Section 11. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, paragraph, clause, or provision
161	of the Ordinance shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or
162	unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause, or provision shall not affect any of the
163	remaining provisions of the Ordinance.
164	
165	Section 12. REPEALER CLAUSE. All bylaws, orders, Ordinances and Ordinances, or
166	parts thereof, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent only of such inconsistency.
167	This repealer shall not be construed to revive any bylaw, order, Ordinance or Ordinance, or part
168	thereof, heretofore repealed.
