- **A. Survey Questionnaire.** To help with long range planning, the library will conduct a customer survey. The most recent survey is 7 years old.
- **B. Friends of the Corrales Library.** The FOCL spent \$3,875.00 for children's programs.
 - C. Fundraising. Book sales and other donations raised \$3,274.00 in 2003.
- **D. Library Anniversary.** The FOCL are discussing way for celebrating the library building's 25th anniversary in the fall.

V. Other Business.

A. Improvements. The Director suggested that some future village bond monies might be used to install a security light near the band shell. The board passed a motion to support village governments' efforts to plan and fund lighting and parking improvements.

Members of the board and other attendees discussed the possibility of converting the library building to refrigerated air from evaporative cooling.
