# Library Personnel

Total scheduled (desk) volunteer hours for the month of February 2008: 342 hours.

Edwina attended a two day workshop designed to bring earth and space science into the library sponsored by the New Mexico State Library and the Lunar and Planetary Institute, a partner of NASA. Librarians met with NASA scientists and received training in related hands-on science inquiry activities.

#### **Library News**

We are now keeping a count on computer users on the Gates computers. In February, there were a total of 790 computer users signed in.

There were 1,286 hits on the Library's website during the month of January.

Beginning in January, the library offered a World Book database on line for reference use from home. Patrons may access it from the library's webpage. It includes materials for kindergarten thru college age with maps, images and excerpts from books available. Erica is working with the Cottonwood Montessori School to provide a workshop to teachers on using the database.

The Friends of the Library had their annual meeting in the library on January 28<sup>th</sup>. A special program was featured with Jim Belshaw and Fred Harris speaking on writing and Political Science. It was a very entertaining evening.

The annual Silent Auction for the Friends of the Corrales Library will be held Sunday, April 27<sup>th</sup> at Village Pizza. Tickets are \$15.00 in advance and are available at the library.

Game board night continues to be popular with our teens on Tuesday evenings in the library.

The library has experienced problems with the server running the circulation and cataloging software. The most current backup of all library information went back one week and created a gap in records of books checked in or out during Valentine's week. Isacsoft, our vendor for the library software, is preparing a bid to purchase a server designed with a Linux operating system that will run much more efficiently than the Microsoft platform currently in use.
